Milestone Summer for Larnaca's Tourism

ollowing a successful 2016 summer season, with the city welcoming 11.4 percent of Cyprus' total tourist arrivals, Larnaca is expected to achieve even higher numbers this year with equally positive data.

According to Larnaka Tourism Board and Cyprus' Statistical Service, 2016's summer season was the best of the last decade with the city attracting 363,264 tourists out of a total of 3,186,531 travellers visiting Cyprus.

Moreover, according to the estimates of tour operators, occupancy in the city's hotels is expected to be satisfactory until October. Through its *Winter Experiences Programme* the destination is aiming to attract tourists during the whole year by enhancing the visitor's experience with various activities including wine tasting, bird watching, basketry and the preparation of traditional dishes.


Ayia Napa Named New Tourism Ambassadors

When awarding the family, Karoussos expressed his gratitude to them for consistently choosing the town for their getaways and added, "For us, you are now considered residents of Ayia Napa."








Palinuro Sailed into Larnaca Port

The ship was built in France in 1934 and was initially a fishing boat that was used to catch cod off the coast of Canada before turning into a sail training vessel for the Italian Navy.


















Paphos Hub Celebrates 20 Years of Operations



n the occasion of celebrating Pafos International Airport's 20 years of operations, Nikos Shacolas, honourary-lifetime chairman, Hermes Airports, Panayiotis Hadjipantelis, chairman, board of directors, Hermes Airports, and Eleni Kaloyirou, CEO, Hermes Airports, gave a tour of the hub to local mayors, members of parliament and various representatives of the region's institutions.

Every year we treat more and more donkeys on Island and 2016 was no exception with 274 visited! Many of them were receiving their first vet and fairlier treatments and we were extremely pleased that their owners were been to learn about how to take care of their denkeys.

We also net a lot of very young feels that were born this year; one born only three days before we arrived. Several of the owners had already confacted us asking for advice of feeding the mare and taking good care of mother and baby. They were very grateful that we could go and check the feels, give further advice and show then how to get the feel used to being handled.



Unfortunately there continue to be deskeys fixing in lamble conditions without the basic care they require. Plastic, general rubbish, dangerous string, wire and metal, fifthy water (if there is any), noting wegetable and other inappropriate food are sights we self come across.

The majority of owners will take notice of our requests and advice, personierly if they one un picking up some of the nubbish in front of them. However, some do not and over the whole we will be collecting evidence of the type of clustions we come across to present to the authorities.

As most of you know, we do not have any legal jurisdiction and cannot force people to take better care of their animals. Without support from the authorities the lives of these donkeys will continue to be unacceptable. The Animal Wetfare Act is quite cliear about causing suffering and we will push to got the Law apheld. It's a painfully slow process but with your support, not only would we be able to try our herdest to do this but also continue to visit and teachman donkeys and improve their lives.





The exhibition titled *A journey through the culture of Cycladic islands* constitutes a concise presentation of the large scale exhibition *Cycladic Society 5,000 years ago* organised this year by Goulandris Museum of Cycladic Art on the occasion of its 30th anniversary.

Since no written sources of the Early Cycladic period survive, the exhibition aims to inform the public in a simple and straightforward manner on the social structure, activities, living environment, and, where possible, convictions and beliefs of the Cycladic islanders in the Early Bronze Age through their creations.


